"EVERY CHANGE STARTS WITH SETTING AN EXAMPLE"

For Prime Minister of Belgium Alexander De Croo, now is the time to work together, have honest conversations and provide solutions. From the power of optimism to the need to break stereotypes, he believes that liberals can be the force for positive change across Europe. In this exclusive interview, Prime Minister De Croo shares his perspective ahead of a pivotal year for Belgian and European politics. 2024 is a big year for Belgium Over the past few years, Europe and for Europe, as the current has political mandates are coming to their end. In your view, what will be the biggest challenges and opportunities for Belgian and European liberals in the coming year?

In Belgium, but also in other European countries, many young people will vote for the first time next year. They may have to do so while a war rages on our continent. just a few thousand kilometres away. They will do so after Europe's hottest summer on record. Many people, not just the young, are wondering if tomorrow will be better than today. We seem to live in an uncertain world, where only negative news sells.

Liberal politicians who ask for the voters to have confidence in them must also give that confidence. If we want to convince young people to vote for liberals, it can only be with results - not with false, flat, populist answers, neither with naivety nor with a discourse that is dividing our societies.

What young Europeans expect from us is modern governance that makes their lives better, that helps them on their way to a job or to a house. What they expect from us is to be pragmatic and ambitious at the same time.

But not everyone is feeling negative, or predicting the end of the world. There is a large silent majority that collaborates with each other and does their part for society. This is why politicians too must work together, bridge divides and engage in honest, open conversations with the citizens.

faced one crisis after another. Perhaps unsurprisingly, **Europeans are feeling less hopeful** about the future and have an increasing distrust in politics. Extremists have been very skilled at conveying a message of fear to voters. How can we do the same, but with a message of hope?

It is perfectly human that wars, pandemics and extreme weather conditions generate insecurity. So does inflation.

Tapping into peoples' fears and insecurities in such times is easy giving solutions isn't. Where populists are in government, they also struggle to offer solutions. Think of Italy for example: Has Giorgia Meloni stopped the boats from coming? Of course not. Did Boris Johnson make the NHS "great again" after leaving the EU? Of course not.

As long as I live, I will remain an optimist. I believe that a message of hope can resonate with citizens, because every human being wherever they come from, whatever they believe in and whatever language they speak – has the inherent desire to make their lives better.

The fake solutions of the extremists won't do that. They offer quick fixes with negative long-term consequences and less freedom. Or, they offer solutions which might be good for some people, but are detrimental to others and therefore further increase inequality.

What we must never do is surrender our democracies to disinformation and fake news. Anti-democratic forces distort reality and spread lies, sometimes at the expense of our children's safety. In Belgium for example, schools have been under attack following fake news about sex education classes and rumours about schools teaching children how to masturbate. That goes way too far.

lt's fundamental that citizens can vote in safe and democratic elections, that our freedoms and values remain ours and that we continue to provide equal opportunities for all.

Belgium has also been through a series of national crises, from deadly floods to increased violence in the streets of Brussels. What are some of the liberal policy solutions to tackle these challenges, now and in the future?

The worst thing to do would be to close our eyes and ignore reality. Too many politicians still do this. To tackle the problem, you need to first call it out. This is where liberals can make a difference.

I often hear voices saying it is too late, that we need to give up, blame the "boomers" or stop trying. I always say: "Let's not panic, let's organise. Let's not worry and contemplate, let's act."

The green transition offers a huge opportunity for companies to make money. If we look at what Belgian companies are doing when it comes to things like offshore energy or hydrogen, we can be proud. International partnerships are being set up to create solutions and create iobs, at the same time. It's a win-win. That's what liberal solutions look like.

You have been a champion of women's rights and women's participation in politics for a long time and have famously said that you don't need to be a woman to be a feminist. How can we involve more men as allies to support women to take their seats around political tables?

Every change starts with setting an example. I am very proud that my government is gender-balanced, and I have a transgender minister in my core team – the first in the world.

The fact that our media hasn't written a thousand articles on the subject shows that this is the new normal. And it really is. Female ministers on television responsible for the budget, for defence, for foreign affairs – children will grow up thinking that this is not an exception, but the norm.

Liberals like to talk about freedom. To me, the most liberating thing we can do is to break stereotypes, to break away from all mental limitations. That's why in my book, I write that gender equality will also liberate men, as they too will have the opportunity to break away from the stereotypes imposed on them.



UNITED FOR DEMOCRACY AND PROGRESS

In Austria, populism is nothing new. But how can liberals fight back, without imitating the populists' game? Our strength as liberals lies in the ability to look beyond short-term thinking and find real solutions that unite Europe, writes NEOS leader **Beate Meinl-Reisinger.**

With the European elections coming closer, the populist threat has become the talk of the town, or better, the Union. This is a development that doesn't come as a surprise, one must admit. It is during times of uncertainty, conflict, economic hardship and environmental catastrophe that people have been drawn towards the political extremes, time and time again. The multimillion-euro question is how we can counter this rising populism and extremism. A question that engages scholars and politicians alike, and fills entire libraries.

The decades-long Austrian experience with populism shows

A strong European Union is the biggest guarantee for peace and prosperity on our continent

one thing clearly: populists are not defeated, but instead strengthened by those who attempt to imitate their game. Spurred by the fear of losing voters, conservative parties easily fall into the populist trap. Desperate to remain in power, they present policies labelled as centrist that have no place in the political centre.

While imitating the populists' game is not an option, withdrawing from the public debate isn't either. Democracy dies in darkness. As liberals, we must not shy away from seeking confrontation.

Unsurprisingly, a look at populist party programmes across the continent shows that populists are excellent fire alarms but terrible fire fighters. They exceed at showcasing all the challenges our societies are grappling with, but fail to find real solutions.

Our strength as liberals lies in the ability to look beyond. While the Kickls, the Le Pens and the Orbáns of Europe aim to fortify national borders, liberals unite in Europe's best interest. In doing so, we must not get tired of showing Europe's citizens that a strong European Union is the biggest guarantee for peace and prosperity on our continent.

FIGHTING FOR A EUROPEAN FUTURE

23 June 2022 was a historic day for Moldova, when the country was granted EU candidate status. For Moldovan liberals, EU accession is not only a catalyst for much-needed reforms, but hope for a better future, writes **Igor Munteanu**, leader of Coaliția pentru Unitate și Bunăstare (CUB).

Just one and a half years after gaining EU candidate status alongside Ukraine, the impact on Moldova has been profound. Not only in terms of access to preaccession funds and incentivising reforms, candidate status brings us together around a unified national project: EU accession. The required reforms will make our government more accountable and professional, and transform our administration for the better. These are just a few of the reasons why our party CUB is a dedicated supporter of Europe in Moldova, though accession talks may take many years.

Nevertheless, there is an alternative project, bitterly advocated by Russia as an opposing force to our shared

European future – a Euro-Asian Union. The Russian aggression against Ukraine, starting in 2014, has only intensified efforts to destabilise our country.

As a liberal, pro-EU party, CUB is fighting back against this malign influence by strengthening rule of law, good governance and a free market economy. We aim to cure Moldova of inefficiency, kleptocratic influence and lingering Soviet legacies, and are asking citizens for a chance to tackle these issues together.

CUB is made up of entrepreneurs, managers, lawyers, doctors and civil servants that view liberal reforms as the most important way to advance Moldova's European path and protect individual freedoms and liberties. By supporting a competitive economy, reforming the tax system and decreasing bureaucracy, we will foster digitalisation and invest in public education.

Judiciary reforms are urgently needed in Moldova, and CUB is determined to ensure fair evaluation of judges and prosecutors, as well as pursuing police reform. Guided by the principles of social justice and solidarity, we will pave the road towards responsible economic freedom, a fair justice system, a professionalised civil service and an end to corruption and bribery.

Our motto is: *"Freedom is our main guide for politics"*. CUB is a unique political force in Moldova, and we believe that freedom and democratic values will move Moldova forward, towards EU accession and transforming our country from within.




TEN LIBERAL MAYORS SUMMITS: A FORCE FOR CHANGE

As a response to a growing demand to hear the voices of Liberal Mayors on matters of European relevance, the **Renew Europe Group in the European Committee of the Regions** created the **Liberal Mayors Summit** and the subsequent **Liberal Mayors Network**. After ten Summits, it's time to celebrate and to reflect what set everything in motion.

The Liberal Mayors Summit aims at boosting liberal mayors and their messages and policies, for instance by calling on all mayors to reinforce the pillars of urban democracy with our declaration to stop authoritarian populists, by promoting European values through our call on Europe Day or by laying down the foundations for the Liberal Mayors Network that meets annually on different topics, such as the rule of law, with European Commission Vice-President Věra Jourová, and the future of mobility, with Executive Vice-President Margrethe **Vestager**. The Network has also set out a document that features principles for making cities liberal and actions that a liberal mayor could take.

The Liberal Mayors Summit take place at least once a year during the ALDE Party Congress. The very first of these meetings convened in Budapest in 2015. It covered topics such as migration, refugees, and integration – topics that still define our continent today. The Summit was positively welcomed by the attendees, and it was evident that this new initiative was important for the mayors themselves. This kind of platform to discuss issues taking place at local and regional levels, yet having relevance at European level, is needed to exchange best practices or to find cross-border, European solutions.

The next Liberal Mayors Summit will take place at the ALDE Party Congress. The Liberal Mayors Network is open to all European Liberal Mayors representing at least 5,000 citizens in their municipalities, or Deputy Mayors of capital cities. "Mayors really appreciate these summits because while every town is different, these summits reveal that there are some big topics which are common to all and this leads to two conclusions: that no mayor is alone and together we can help each other, and that it's the European Union that is often the best placed to provide a solution."

D66 members elected Rob Jetten as party leader in August. The 36-year-old, who already became D66's youngest-ever parliamentary leader in 2018, steered the party through a challenging election campaign this autumn. He was influential during his time as Minister of Climate and Energy since January 2022, crucially engineering plans for a climate accord designed to cut CO₂ emissions in half by 2030.

Previously a city councillor for the Polish city of Wrocław, Jolanta Niezgodzka stood in her first parliamentary election in October and was elected to the Sejm representing the Wrocław constituency. The 32-year-old board member of Nowoczesna advocates for a more representative and inclusive society and focuses on working with various non-governmental organisations on abortion, women's rights, animal shelters and foster care.

34-vear-old environmentalist Tamara Stohlová broke onto the political scene in October when she was selected as the fourth lead candidate on Progresívne Slovensko's electoral list and subsequently elected as a Member of Parliament in Slovakia for the first time. She considers herself a "green politician" and is engaged in issues ranging from environmental protection and animal welfare, to problems facing young people today.

In August Dilan Yeşilgöz-Zegerius replaced outgoing Prime Minister Mark Rutte as the new VVD party leader, the first woman in history to do so. The daughter of two asylum seekers, she arrived into the Netherlands at the age of seven and already served as the country's Minister of Justice and Security since January 2022, advocating for criminal justice reform and tougher measures to combat terrorism.
